MISSION CAMP CHECKLIST

DEADLINES

- ASAP upon receipt from Mission Specialist** - Submit church vehicle information and Mission Site Preference Survey
- Jan 31st** - \$75 per person deposits due
- May 1st** - Final date to drop spots without incurring \$75 cancellation fee
- 14 Days Before Camp** - Submit your Participant List, Church Agreement, Certificate of Insurance, Waivers, and Final Balance
- 5 Days Before Camp** - Submit Step 2-Room Assignments on the Participant List

PROMOTIONS

- Download images for social media and print on Step 1 of the Prep Center
- Post digital images to Facebook, Instagram, Church Website, etc.
- Display posters around your church
- Begin sign-ups (downloadable sign-up sheet available on Step 1 of the Prep Center)
- Download videos from studentlife.com/videos
- Show videos during youth group and church services
- Plan and schedule fundraisers

PARENT MEETING

- Review forms on Step 2 of the Prep Center
- Provide parents with the link to submit online waivers
- Prepare information packets using Parent Packet (Prep Center), Church Medical Release Form (church use only), and any church-specific information
- Give information packets to students whose parents do not attend the Parent Meeting

ADULT LEADER MEETING

- Recruit adult leaders and Bible Study leaders (Life Group Leaders)
- Perform a background check in order to complete page 2 of the Church Agreement
- Have all adults complete Child Protection Training
- Download Bible Study curriculum from the Prep Center (available in the spring)
- Outline adult leader expectations (see church agreement), roles at camp, schedule, etc.
- Distribute Bible Study curriculum (hard copies or link to website)
- Optional: hold a separate training session for those who will be serving as Life Group Leaders to help them prepare to teach the Bible Study at camp

COMPLETE BEFORE CAMP

- Finalize your transportation plans
- After receiving mission site assignment(s), connect with mission site contact(s)
- Discuss mission site assignment details/expectations with your group
- Complete and send mission site waivers/volunteer forms if necessary (will be sent along with mission site assignment)
- Complete background checks on all adult leaders
- Submit your Church Agreement
- Submit your Participant List
- Pay Final Balance
- Ensure all Waiver and Release forms are submitted (students and adults)
- Edit Participant List with updates
- Announce your Camp Squad color to your students (emailed to you 26 days before camp)

"May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all." 2 CORINTHIANS 13:14

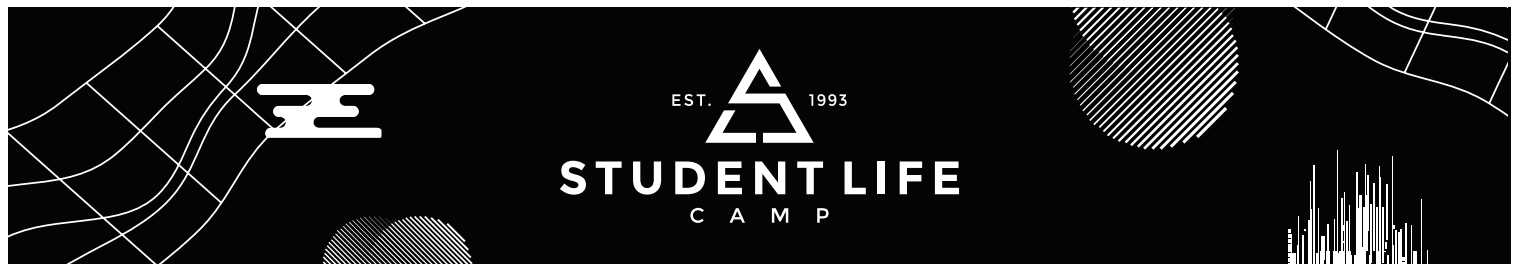
BIBLE STUDY FOCUSES

The Father

BIBLE STUDY FOCUSES

The Son

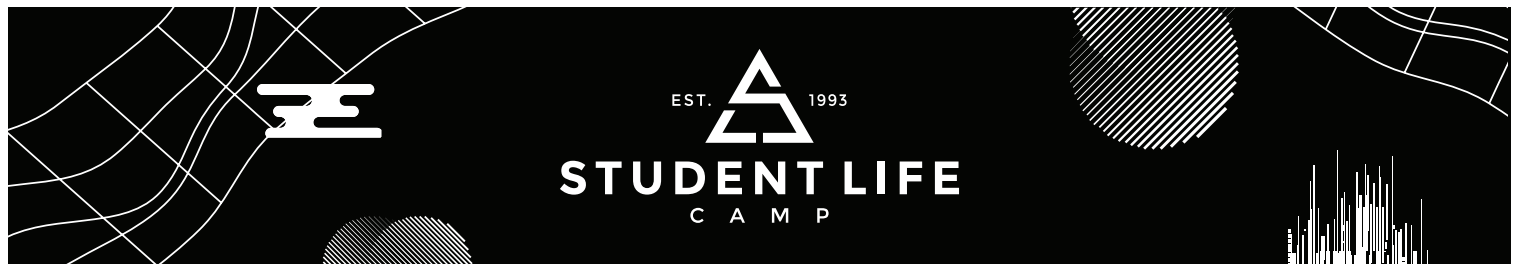
When Jesus died on the cross, something Earth shattering happened. Not only did Jesus take on the weight of the world's sin, but the presence of God came to dwell among us as well. Jesus is fully God, and everything that Jesus did reveals more about the character of God. Jesus loved lepers, prostitutes, and outcasts. He sought the meek and used them for His ministry in ways that are still countercultural. This same Jesus is the same Jesus that died on the cross for our sins and rose from the dead. This Jesus is the same God that created the universe and reigns victorious over Heaven and Earth. When we look at the character of Jesus, we see a man who humbled Himself to die for our sins. Jesus is the embodiment of God chasing after us as we run from Him.

MAIN PASSAGE // Luke 15: 1-7, Matthew 18: 10-14

The Holy Spirit

Before the death and resurrection of Christ, God's people did not have the access that we have to the Holy Spirit now. The Holy Spirit is one of God's many kindnesses to us. While we wait for God to return and create His perfect kingdom, we have access to God through His Word and His Spirit. His Spirit guides us and comforts us as we live life in a broken world. The Holy Spirit is present and with us as we study God's Word and seek to discern how to live our lives, in the little stuff and the big decisions that can feel so overwhelming. While we wait for the new Heaven and new Earth, the Holy Spirit is with us every second of every day.

MISSION CAMP PACKING LIST

Check with your leader for electronics and cell phone guidelines

WHAT TO BRING

- Appropriate, casual clothing for four nights of Worship
- Appropriate, comfortable clothing for three days of mission project activities (recommended to bring clothes that can get dirty)
- Appropriate, comfortable clothing for the trip home
- Pajamas
- Closed toe shoes (for mission project)
- Bible, pen & notebook
- Towels and washcloths
- Toiletries
- Bedding and pillow (unless told otherwise)
- Spending money for snacks and Student Life Store
- Watch and/or alarm clock
- Sunscreen
- Sunglasses and/or hat (for mission project)
- Water bottle
- Bugspray
- Swimsuit and beach towel (for pool if available)
- Hand Sanitizer
- Hand Soap for Bathrooms

Additional items needed for your church group (Ex: money for lunch on the trip home):

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Tobacco, drugs, vape pens, or alcohol
- Fireworks, water balloons, or weapons
- Skateboards, roller skates or roller blades

CAMP DRESS CODE

- No clothing that reveals undergarments
- No short shorts or skirts
- No speedos or midriff-baring bathing suits
- No clothing with questionable sayings, slogans, etc.
